Policy & Procedures

Throughout the course of 2013, MADGRL worked to update the

Coordinator and Volunteer Handbooks, This was an effort to provide revised guidance and enhanced policies and procedures designed to foster best practices in processing new Danes for placement in their forever homes. Revisions to previous procedures were implemented in order to bring MAGDRL in line with changes to insurance standards.



Forms held in these handbooks were updated to provide enhanced specificity based on coordinator feedback.



Coaching toward a finer level of detail during evaluations and vet-checks empowers Coordinators and Match-makers with information that may become useful in identifying ideal fosters and/or adopters.

Virginia

2013 was a tough year for VA. We saw many of our long time



Dane Ambassadors age-out and were no longer able to help at events. Sadly, our expenses for 2013 were extremely high topping \$30,000 (our highest since 2008.) This was due in part to several dogs brought in from a humane foundation who needed extensive vet care, and due to kennel fees for some very special Danes.

We are happy to report that all the dogs coming in from the hu-

mane foundation found wonderful loving homes as did the two long-term resident kennel Danes.

Despite our fiscal challenges, we were able to bring in over \$18,000 thanks in large part to application donations and most Importantly, to adoptions!

The MD/DC Chapter had a successful 2013. We had new volun-



teers who began doing Meet and Greets in areas where we previously lacked a presence. As a result, we had an increased number of inquiries about adoption.

We do struggle

with finding new foster homes. Many who foster end up adopting, then are unable to foster again. Other chapters have been very gracious taking in Danes from our Chapter that we are unable to foster in-state.

We have a dedicated phone screening team consisting of four

adoption screeners and two give up screeners. We had 445 contacts about adoption and 112 phone interviews were completed. We received 35 adoption applications. We had 108 give up inquiries, although not all of those went to a first contact or full evaluation.



We have very dedicated volunteers and we are quite well traveled - our volunteers are always willing to help with transports and have logged many miles moving Danes along the east coast.

NJ continues to be a successful chapter because we are blessed with

volunteers have stepped up again and again and for this I am so grateful. Even though we did not have a single large fundraiser in 2013, we were able to consistently raise funds throughout the year and our income more than met our expenses, something for which





I want to take this opportunity to thank my Assistant Chapter Coordinator Pat Ali and all of my team leaders who help keep NJ running smoothly. Without their help and input, we could never do the work we do. I look forward to continuing our mission with this outstanding team in the future.

West Virginia

Last year, we focused on recruiting people to help us with evalua-

tions – our biggest need by far — outside the Eastern Panhandle. We had some success, particularly in the southeast, and will continue to work on that area. Our transport team worked like clockwork, enabling quick intakes after evaluations. We also had several fosters step up to help, allowing us to foster the majority of our dogs in-state with only one kennel stay. This allowed us to help three dogs with medical issues who needed to be nursed back to health prior to adoption.

WV appointed a new fundraising team who did an amazing job

with despite being limited to less than six months and with no way to plan ahead for a large event. They held eight outreach events to continue connecting with the community, and our overall inquiries stayed right at 220 for the year.

Last year was a story of big challenges and an amazing team of volunteers who got us through it. We've already started working on our game plan for 2014 which promises to be a great year.

Pennsylvania/Delaware

Our Chapter continues to amaze with our fundraising efforts and

2013 was a busy year for NY. We received over 460 inquiries






